held in Ottawa in the Ottawa Convention Center from June 10-15 2012.

It was, the first ever paperless IEEE Conference. E very registrant was

given a Blackberry Playbook (tablet), with the Conference programme and

complete proceedings preloaded, and with a number of extremely useful

apps, including access to e-mail and a number of other communicating and

social media tools, video camera, and much more. • Senior Canadian

Government officials were involved in the Conference, and with Ottawa

being the Capital of Canada, the whole week was dec lared IEEE Week –a

unique event for the IEEE. · An Industry Forum was organised in the

Exhibition hall, in the evening, where leading comm unications industry

leaders were quizzed by a TV journalist, who hersel f was very

knowledgeable, having recently written an important book on business innovation.

This was in addition to several keynote plenary sessions.  $\cdot$  The

Conference Banquet was an impressive affair that in cluded a medley of

music, and some very impressive ethnic dancing and variety presentations,

rounded by a young and incredibly talent singer. As an interlude, one of

Canada's leading entrepreneur, Sir. Terry Matt hews, spoke about his

experiences of starting more than 180 companies, se veral of them growing

to a market capital of over C\$1 Bn. He was very ins pirational, and an

incredible catch for an IEEE event. . The conference had record number of

workshops . The conference also had two co-located events: HIC Workshop

and the WIE Discussion Panel. Both of them were very well attended. . The

Mayor of Ottawa inaugurated the conference while the Honorable Minister

communicate and collaborate not just only through the conference but also

through other means such as group events on the fir st day of the

conference after the reception. The group event cul minated in the Mosaica

light show at the Parliament Hill.
