ABSTRACT: Epilepsy is a common chronic neurological disorder characterized by a predisposition to epileptic seizures, and by the neurobiologic, cognitive, psychological, and social consequences of the condition. The primary diagnostic tool in the epilepsy is the electroencephalogram (EEG), in which epileptic seizures become apparent as characteristics, usually rhythmic signals, often coinciding with or even preceding the earliest observable changes in behavior. Their detection can, thus, be used to react to impending or ongoing seizure or to differentiate epileptic seizures from other conditions with paroxysmal seizure-like symptoms. Several attempts have been made so far to automatically detect seizures. However, none of these methods have found widespread application. One may raise an obvious question as to why seizure recognition is so difficult. This talk will cover generic techniques for automatic detection of epileptic seizures, and how we address the challenges in its recognition by a computationally simple architecture.

3.2 Learning to Play Games - A new IEEE eLearning Library Tutorial Like playing Ms. Pac-Man or Othello? A new IEEE eLearning Library Tutorial, Learning to Play Games, by Simon Lucas, teaches game strategy learning functions used in developing these types of games. The tutorial will cover the two main approaches to learning game strategy: evolution (including co-evolution) and temporal difference learning. It also discusses some ways of hybridizing both. Each method will be demonstrated with reference to some simple fragments of software, illustrating how the learning algorithm is connected with the game and with the function approximation architecture.
